Our strength lies in our exceptional team. This year, we welcomed two new full-time staff members and celebrated the graduation of four student employees. Last fall, we participated in MSU's first-ever Innovation Accelerator, where our pitch for "embedded career development across campus" won the people's choice award and was selected for further exploration. To this end, we continue to collect data on the post-graduation plans of our seniors to help refine our offerings.





STUDENT CONTACT BY YEAR



CONFIDENCE IN DECISION-MAKING



Scale of 1-10 with 10 being the most confident

In our **career counseling** appointments, staff members assist students with their major and career exploration through the use of evidence-based assessments.

Pre-appointment: Prior to meeting with our team, students are asked to rate their current level of confidence in their ability to make a decision regarding their career and/or major.

Post-appointment: When asked the same question after the series of career counseling appointments, students reported statistically significant* gains in their confidence about making career and major decisions.


KNOWLEDGE OF OPPORTUNITIES

We also offer **major exploration** appointments. Titled "What Can I Do With a Major In...?," these appointments match students with a Career Resources Specialist knowledgeable about career paths in a specific academic area.

Pre-appointment: In a survey prior to their appointment, students are asked, "Please rate your current level of knowledge regarding careers associated with your major(s) of interests."

Post-appointment: After meeting with the Career Center, students reported statistically significant* gains in their knowledge of opportunities available in their academic major.

Outside the walls of our offices, the Career Center ventures into many opportunities for student connections across campus. From partnering with academic departments to provide relevant in-class presentations and faculty-requested class assignments, to presenting for **student organizations**, we strive to meet the career needs of our campus community.

The Career Center also hosts several free workshops throughout the year, like our Résumé Cafe events and Mock Interview Day. Our Career Resources Specialists and Student Career Ambassadors make themselves accessible by hosting Career Corners and Career Center Tabling throughout the semester. Students dive even deeper by enrolling in IDS 120, our academic course on exploring majors and careers.




CAREER FAIR STUDENT ATTENDEES BY YEAR IN SCHOOL

2022-2023 STUDENT SUCCESS AFTER GRADUATION



Knowledge Rate is the percent of graduates for which the institution has reasonable and verifiable first-destination information. The 2022-2023 knowledge rate for Missouri State University is 69.7%. The 2017-2019 knowledge rate averaged 91%, and after sinking to the post-COVID low of 63% between 2020-2022, it is on the rise again.
